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GREECE IN BRIEF

For thousands of years Greece was the gate between the East and the West. Located where the three continents worldwide (Europe, Asia, Africa) meet, Greece is a country whose history and culture is truly unique. The ancient Greek classical and Hellenistic eras were without doubt the most beautiful times, having left behind a myriad of ideas, concepts and the basics of what we nowadays “western civilization”.

Greece is the birthplace of democracy, western philosophy, the Olympic Games, Western literature, historiography, political science, major scientific and mathematical principles, and Western drama, including both tragedy and comedy. The rich historical legacy of Greece is reflected in large by its World Heritage Sites, which is the most famous in Europe and all over the world.

Today Greece is a democratic and developed country with an advanced high-income economy, a high quality of life and a very high standard of living. A founding member of the United Nations, Greece was the tenth member to join the Euro-

pean Communities (precursor to the European Union) and has been part of the Eurozone since 2001. It is also a member of numerous other International Institutions, including the Council of Europe, North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), World Trade Organization (WTO), Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), and the Organization International de la Francophonie (OIF). Greece’s unique cultural heritage, subsequently large tourism industry, and prominent shipping sector classify it as a middle power. It is the largest economy in the Balkans, and it is considered an important regional investor.



GREECE IN BRIEF

THE GREEK LANGUAGE

The official language of the country is Greek. The dialects of Ancient Greece have greatly influenced both the modern Greek language as well as the vocabularies of many languages spoken worldwide nowadays. The Greek alphabet and the Greek language have contributed much to all western languages. English, German, French, Italian and Spanish are among the languages taught as secondary languages at educational institutions throughout the country but due to the large amount of tourists from all over the world, other languages are also widely spoken such as Russian, Turkish, Chinese etc.

RELIGION

The Greek Constitution recognizes Eastern Orthodox as the “prevailing” faith of the country, while guaranteeing freedom of religious belief for all. Religious and ethnic minorities are spread across the country and are still contributing to the society in various fields.

POLITICS

The politics of Greece takes place in a parliamentary representative democratic republic, whereby the Prime Minister of Greece is the head of government, and of a multi-party system. Legislative power is vested in both the government and the Hellenic Parliament

• TRAVEL INFORMATION

Greece is centrally situated and very easily accessible both from all European countries as well as from overseas. Its location is one of the greatest assets. Greece is located at the southeast end of Europe and it is the

southernmost country of the Balkan Peninsula and is referred to as a southern European country but because of its culture, economy, membership in the European Union, Greece is also part of “Western Europe”.

• VISA INFORMATION

- As an European Union (EU) country and a Schengen territory Greece is accessible without any constraints to all European countries as well as non-European ones. For all countries requiring visa, the SMAG and the Congress Secretariat will provide all the necessary assistance in order to assure all participants obtain their visa.

- All E.U. citizens can enter Greece without a passport or visa

- A valid Identity Card (ID) is required (Driving licenses are not accepted instead of an ID card.)

- In all nationalities cases a Visa is required if the traveler does not hold a valid ID card or a valid passport.

- Citizens of all other countries should contact the nearest Greek Consulate office or the Greek Embassy in order to be properly informed on visa requirements.

• SANTORINI AT A GLANCE

- Santorini is the southernmost island of Cyclades and is located between Ios and Anafi.
- It is 128 nautical miles away from the port of Piraeus and 63 nautical miles away from Crete.
- Its size is 76 square km and the length of its shores is 69 km. The perimeter is approximately 36 nautical miles.
- Thera, Therassia, Aspronisi and the volcanoes (Palaia Kameni and Nea Kameni where the crater of the volcano exists) form the cluster of islands which is called Santorini.
- It is included, together with Methana, Nisiros and Milos, in the most active of volcanoes in Greece.
- The three main islands form a "ring" around the Caldera, the bay which was created when the central part of ancient Strongyli sank to the seabed. Its dimensions are 8x5 km and its depth is as low as 370 m.
- The great crater formed by the volcanic eruption of around 1600 BC, adds to its distinct atmosphere: settlements are built on the edge of the crater's inner walls and not on the sea level, as in other islands. In addition, Santorini is one of the few places worldwide where architectural complexes of underground rock-hewn houses still survive inside the volcanic soil.
- The Caldera and the whole cluster of the Santorini islands have been characterized as an area of outstanding natural beauty.
- The name Thera is taken after the legendary settler Theras of Sparta, who settled in the island and founded the homonymous town in Mesa Vouno approximately the

10th century B.C.

- The name Santorini was given in 1153 by the Venetians and is referred to Arab geographer Edrisi. It is a pronunciation of both words Santa and Irene (Saint Irene), taken after either from the name of the church in the valley of Therassia, or from the name of the early Christian basilica in Perissa, which is not preserved.
- The main island, Thera, has a shape of a half moon and is located in the easternmost position of the cluster. The west side consists of the walls of the Caldera which preserve the picture of its geological history and illustrate the different phases of the volcanic activity.
- There are 13 villages in Thera and 3 villages in Therassia.
- The capital of the island is Fira. The name derived from corruption of the word Thera, which is the official one.

• GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION



The Santorini group of islands is consisted of Thera, Thirasia, Aspronisi, Palea and Nea Kameni (Volcanoes) islands.

It is located in the most southern part of the Cyclades group of islands in the Aegean Sea,

about 117 km (63 nautical miles) north of Crete and about 200 km (108 nautical miles) southeast of Greece's mainland

• WEATHER



The climate in Santorini is typical of the Mediterranean climate: generally extended periods of sunshine throughout most of the year, relatively warm and dry summers and mild and rainy winters.

The year can be broadly subdivided into two main seasons: the warm and dry season lasting from April until October and the cold and rainy season lasting from November until the end of March.

Long periods of consecutive rainy days are not common in Santorini, even during the winter, and the sky does not remain cloudy for more than a few days in a row, as it does in other regions of the world.

During the warm and dry season the weather is usually stable, the sky is clear, the sun is bright and there is generally no rainfall. A sweater/jacket is advised, especially in April and October, as evenings often bring cooler temperatures.

• SANTORINI BEACHES



Santorini is famous for its unique beaches with volcanic sands, such as the Kokkini and Aspri beaches located near the settlement of Akrotiri, on the southern coast of the island and the grey and black beaches in Kamari, Perissa, Perivolos, and Monolithos, situated on the eastern coast of the island. Other beautiful Santorini beaches are located along the northern shores, such as Ammoudi, Armeni, Baxedes, Paradissos, Koloubos, and Vourvoulou.



• SANTORINI SIGHTSEEING



During your holiday in Santorini Island, you should spend a couple of days touring the sites and attractions. A good map of Santorini can help you to plan your touring schedule. The most famous sites in Santorini are the Akrotiri settlement and Ancient Thira. Akrotiri dates back to Prehistoric Times and is considered by many scholars to be linked to the Lost Continent of Atlantis. At this site, you have the opportunity to admire a well-preserved settlement, including houses, stores, staircases, roads and an ancient sewage system. Ancient Thira, which is located on a hill above the villages of Kamari and Perissa, is a marvellous site, complete with ruins of

sanctuaries, an agora, a theatre, a gymnasium, and a graveyard.

Apart from these two spectacular archaeological sites, we also recommend visiting the Gyzi Manor, the two cathedrals and Archaeological, Historical and Prehistoric Thira museums in Fira, as well as the Maritime Museum in Oia and the many Venetian castles, churches and monasteries scattered throughout the island. Finally, dedicate a day to take a boat trip to the volcanic isles of Thirassia, Palea Kammeni and Nea Kammeni, which are located in the Caldera area, opposite Santorini.

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• USEFUL TIPS

Here are some tips that will make your stay easier.

• TIME ZONE DIFFERENCE

Greece is in the Eastern European Time Zone. Eastern European Standard Time (EET) is 2 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+2).

Like most countries in Europe, Summer (Daylight Saving) time is observed in Greece, where the time is moved forward by 1 hour, 3 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+3).

After the summer months the time is moved back by 1 hour to Eastern European Time (EET) or (GMT+2).

Daylight Savings Time (GMT+3) in Greece begins at 3 a.m. on the last Sunday of March and ends at 4 a.m. on the last Sunday of October.

• WI-FI

Most hotels provide Internet access to their guests. Internet cafes are available mostly in Fira. Free wireless Internet access is available in main points in Fira, Oia, Messaria, Imerovigli, Exo Gonia, Pyrgos, Karterados and Akrotiri.

• BANKS

The banks on Santorini are open 8.00 am-2.30 pm Monday to Thursday and 8.00 am-2.00 pm on Friday.

ATMs are available in almost all villages on Santorini. Most accept Visa and MasterCard as well as debit cards of internationally recognized networks.

• WATER

Bottled water is recommended for drinking. Tap water can be used for washing, bathing and cleaning your teeth. Tap water that comes from the local desalination plants is drinkable.

• TELECOMMUNICATIONS

The international access code for Greece is +30. The outgoing code is 00 followed by the relevant country code (e.g. 001 for the USA or Canada, 0044 for the UK).. Public phone card booths are available all over the island and cards can be bought from kiosks, mini markets and OTE. The local mobile phone operators (Vodafone, Wind, Cosmote) use GSM networks and have roaming agreements with most international operators.

• CURRENCY

Since the 1st of January 2002, the Euro (EUR) is the currency of Greece. Notes in circulation are 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 euro while coins are in denominations of 1 euro, 2 euro, 1 cent, 2 cents, 5 cents, 10 cents, 20 cents and 50 cents.

• ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

The electricity supply in Greece is alternating current, 220-250 volts, 50 cycles. Appliances for 110 or 120 volts may be operated by using step down transformers of 220 – 250/110 volts connected to each outlet.

• FORMALITIES FOR ENTERING GREECE

Passport and visa requirements vary from country to country.

• HEALTH

In case of health problems you may visit the Santorini Medical Center in Fira (Tel.: 2286360300-4) or ask your hotel reception for a private specialist doctor. There are pharmacies in Fira, Messaria, Emporeio, Oia, Imerovigli, Pyrgos and Kamari where you can find medicines and advice for minor problems.

Petros M. Nomikos Conference Centre

The Centre is located in the capital of Santorini, Fira, overlooking the caldera and the volcano. This neoclassical mansion with its characteristic red colouring has been transformed into a modern, operational Conference Centre, preserving its traditional character with its cellars, terraces, pots filled with flowers and parterres.

It includes a main conference hall of 178 m² for maximum 200 participants, with particularly good accoustics and air-conditioning, a consultation room for private meetings with the capacity to sit approximately 20 people, room for workshops, registration area, secretarial and technical support facility, areas set aside for coffee breaks, receptions and social events, as well as all of the most modern optical-accoustic equipment meeting the highest standards.

A red-coloured house of neoclassical architecture, a fine sample of what is known as "Ta Kokkina Spitia", meaning "The Red Houses", build around the turn of the century, had stood where The Conference Centre is today.

The Petros M. Nomikos Conference Centre inaugurated in 1989 with the 3rd International Archaeological Congress entitled "Thera and the Aegean World" organised by The Thera Foundation.

• TOUR AND ACTIVITY OPTIONS

If you combine the sun and sky of Greece, with the uniqueness of Santorini island, you have a heaven in your hands. Santorini is a destination of unlimited things to do, and the choices are hard when you have only a limited time available. We have put together a list of tours and activities that can fit all tastes.

Cruises: Choices varying from speed boats to catamarans and sail boats to small engine boats. Whether you are an explorer or a luxury traveller, the options are plenty. Drive a boat on your own, or visit inaccessible corners with a cocktail in your hand. See the white beach from a catamaran and sail past Aspronisi (white island) with the engines turned off. Have a BBQ meal on board, snorkel and swim, see the island from a different point of view.

Walking Tours: Sure, you can walk along a path on your own, who needs a guide for that, right? Wrong! Not all trails have excellent signage but the most important thing is that the walking tours are also designed to give you an experience, not just have someone show you the way. A local will guide you through the history and the present of the trail, show you hidden corners and deviations. Some tours offer wine tasting, visits to local ladies that will cook with you. Choices varying from easy to hard with only small groups of people following. Pick up and drop off to your hotel is also a big plus of these tours as the trails are long so your start and finish points are not the same and a car or scooter cannot be a solution to your transportation.

• TOUR AND ACTIVITY OPTIONS

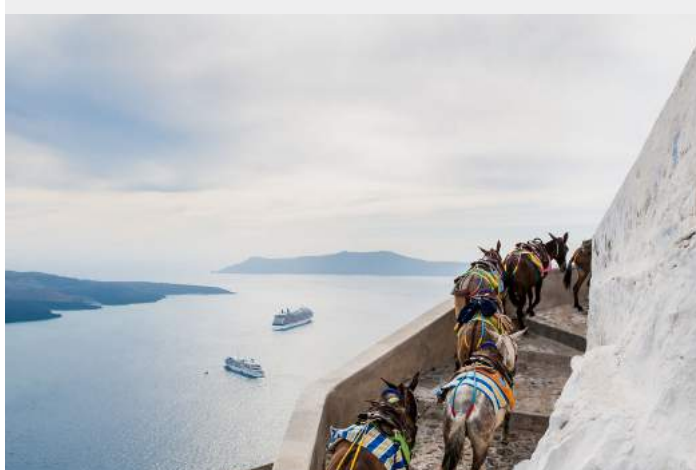
